A word from the Rev'd Gale Hunt our Team Vicar:

This month we have Valentine’s Day and the start of the season of Lent. The connection of St Valentine with lovers seems to be either as the traditional day in mediaeval belief when birds mate, or with the pagan Lupercalia festival in Rome. For Christians, this day marks an acknowledgement of an all-loving God who blesses those who love one another. Why not come along to one of our churches on the Sunday after St. Valentine’s Day and give thanks for all who love you?

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday – 22nd February. Our Team service for Ash Wednesday is at 7.30pm in Durrington Church. We also have our usual 10am service that day in Bulford Church.

But it can be a time of starting something new which enables us to grow spiritually in our walk with God. NETHERAVON AND FITTLETON CHURCHES

We are lucky to have beautiful churches in both Netheravon and Fittleton and both are valued by the populations as village 'assets'. The cost of running the church and the burden of organising weekly services are however both high, and are borne by only a small number of people in each village. Many don't realise that the churches receive no public funding at all and so are 100% reliant on fundraising and volunteers.

From the first Sunday in March, the churches are proposing a trial period of a more collaborative service schedule (see below), with two Sundays a month (the first and third) where the villages actively come together to swell the numbers, share the workload, and enjoy one another's company.

A decision on whether to enact the new trial schedule will be taken on 19 Feb and so comments are invited by **14 Feb** to inform this decision. Please engage with any of the PCC, the Churchwardens, or the Revs Gale Hunt or Philip Bromiley if you have a view; we'd love to hear your thoughts.

Thinking of having a party? The Phoenix Hall is a great venue to hold and celebrate a Wedding Reception, Anniversary or Birthday.

A large car park is available and an outside patio area. The Phoenix Hall has a main hall which has table and chairs for 80+ people and looks really smart when dressed up. There is also a full commercial kitchen fully equipped including crockery, glassware, cutlery and tablecloths.

There is a committee room if you wish to have a smaller gathering. Both the main hall and committee room have a small kitchen.

The heart of our hall is our local community who use it daily and we have a number of regular users covering a wide range of interests, including the weekly Cheerful Cuppa, a chance for a chat with a cup of tea and slice of cake, an older person lunch club, exercise classes, band practices, youth club, art group, monthly prize bingo and pop-up market.

The hall is also used for religious gatherings, sport events, walking groups and craft fairs.

The front door and portable ramp give full disabled access.

The committee of volunteers that runs and manages the hall continues to ask villagers to come forward and offer their time to help support the committee. If you have a little time to give to your community (4 evening meetings a year), why not consider joining our committee? We need people with ideas of how to best develop our hall, who are connected with our community. We are really keen to get new people involved in shaping our community asset so that it can continue to provide relevant services for our villages.

Walking down the High Street it is very noticeable that dog fouling has increased with the dark nights. It is very inconsiderate of people not to pick up dog mess, especially as many children walk along the High Street to School each day. Campylobacterioses and other bacterial diseases can be transmitted to humans by dog faeces. **PLEASE** pick up after your dog. We have zero tolerance in Netheravon and you will be reported to the authorities if you are caught. You could be fined up to £1000 for letting your dog foul the streets or open spaces.

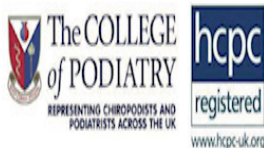

Police and Crime Commissioner Philip Wilkinson's parish column

Listening to recent results of how Wiltshire Police officers feel about their job, their morale and general state of mind causes me great concern.

Hearing people's lived experiences are often very, very, different to what you think you know. I talk to our frontline officers regularly and these results aren't surprising given the last six months Wiltshire Police has had – and how policing is regarded generally at the moment.

But we can't just look at one element of these survey results in isolation.

Everything I, and my office, have been working on in the last few months – getting the right person for our next Chief Constable, the police precept and ensuring we have a budget that balances investment with efficiency, increasing performance, looking at strategic leadership and culture issues – is interconnected with improving morale.

I heard an interesting quote this week: 'Culture eats strategy for breakfast'. And it's so true!

We can have all the strategies, plans, documents we like but if our workplace isn't in a good place, our standards and culture is off balance then we must acknowledge it will have direct impact on those working for the organisation.

Why does this matter? Why aren't we just getting on with policing?

Well, if we have more, happy, satisfied, officers out on our streets – if they are staying in their jobs longer than a few years – then this ultimately has a knock-on effect on our communities, on the police service being delivered and it will contribute to Making Wiltshire Safer – the primary goal of both Wiltshire Police and my office.

Someone said this week that policing had been trading on the goodwill of its officers and staff for quite a long time – it is now time to redress that imbalance.

One good area to start would be to tackle pay - I believe police officers deserve to earn a decent salary – and Wiltshire Police deserves to have a fairer slice of the central government pie.

And that's why I will be adding my voice, along with other PCCs, on both of these issues at a national conference in a few weeks' time.

We all know lobbying for change takes time and that is why, in the meantime, I will be focusing on this – and how to tackle the root causes of these worrying results – over the coming months with our current leadership and our incoming new Chief Constable.

It has been a busy start to 2023 for us all.
