It has been a successful year with lots of positive reports from the Phoenix Hall (and the fantastic village voluntary groups that use it), the Community Allotment/larder and the parish council.

The Phoenix hall has had a very successful year, with a lot of different groups using it. We will soon be refreshing the sign at the bottom of Court Farm Road and adding to it a Platinum Jubilee Walk where the cherry trees have been planted.

## **Fittleton cum Haxton Parish Council**

### **The Annual Parish Meeting was held at Phoenix Hall on 7 May.**

The chairman updated the meeting on some of the key issues of the past year. The defibrillators have been updated with new pads. These life-saving machines are located in Fittleton and Haxton and are available to ensure residents have access to them whenever they may be needed.

There were several planning applications during the last few months - some more complex than others. Cllr Symes has been busy managing the allotments and recruiting replacements for those that had become vacant. She has also represented the parish council on the Phoenix Hall committee.

The Christmas get together was well-supported and, because of the significant rainfall during the preceding months, the decision to move the event to the church was made. It was well received and will certainly be considered for the next event.

A new grit bin was installed at The Pound, Haxton. It is a dangerous area when the temperatures drop and it was timely when the very cold temperatures combined with the ongoing water leak.

For just over 2 weeks there was a significant outpouring of water in the middle of the road just south of The Pound. Special thanks must go to Wiltshire Councillor Ian Blair-Pilling and Parish Councillor Greg Morgan for their efforts to try to ease the situation by digging out a blocked trench.

The Annual General Meeting followed the Annual Parish Meeting and the election of councillors to the various sub committees and groups was undertaken. The end of year accounts had been audited and were recorded at the meeting. Donations to the various local bodies were also confirmed.

The erection of a Speed Indicator Device for the Everleigh Road, Haxton, was formally discussed and it is the parish council's intention to seek the views of parishioners to determine their preferred style of device. A date will be advised in the near future.

The commemorations for the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of D Day were also discussed and the council's donation to the costs was agreed. It is hoped that many villagers will be able to attend this event.

**The next meeting of the parish council is 9 July, 7:30pm at All Saints Church, Fittleton.**

## HOW TO PREVENT "RELAY THEFT"

# KEYLESS CAR THEFT



Cars with keyless entry unlock automatically when the key comes within a short-range of the car.

"Relay theft" occurs when a device is used to trick the car into thinking the key is nearby, unlocking the car and allowing the ignition to start.

### Use a signal-blocking pouch

Signal-blocking pouches are sometimes called Faraday bags or RFID signal blockers/shields. These pouches prevent the signal from your key being captured by electronic devices. It's unclear whether putting your keys in a tin box prevents potential thieves grabbing the signal. Our advice is to choose a product that has been independently tested and approved by Secured by Design.

### Keep keys safe

Avoid leaving your keys near the front door as fishing for keys through the letterbox is a prominent method of stealing them. Grabbing the signal is easier for thieves if the keys are near the front door.

### Disable your key fob

Some key fobs have a switch to turn the wireless signal off. Check your vehicle manual or ask your dealer for advice.

### Use an anti-theft device

Consider using a physical anti-theft device like a steering wheel lock or wheel clamp. Car thieves want to get away quickly without being caught so prefer not to have to attack physical security devices.

### Install a tracker

Tracker systems can increase the chances of recovering your vehicle if it's stolen. Many systems activate once a vehicle is stolen and track it via GPS and other systems. Secured by Design can offer advice on the best system for your vehicle.

### Closed circuit television (CCTV)

As an alternative, consider installing CCTV which can be linked to your television or video to view your drive. If you do decide to use CCTV it is important to read the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) advice on domestic CCTV systems.

## PHOENIX HALL NETHERAVON

(Netheravon and Fittleton Village Hall - Charity No. 1003542)

Jointly owned by Netheravon & Fittleton cum Haxton Parish Councils

PHOENIX HALL NETHERAVON Managed by volunteers.

The Phoenix Hall is a large open venue that provides an excellent facility for many activities/meetings and is used by many to celebrate special occasions. The hall looks very smart all dressed up and a sound system is available. The front door and ramps give full disable access.

The main hall and smaller room both have kitchens. There is also a fully equipped commercial large catering kitchen located at the back of the main hall where all table/glass ware/fridges and cooking equipment are available. In the main hall and included in the hire charge are chairs and a choice of rectangle or large round tables with seating for up to 120 people. Tablecloths are available. The mixed capacity is 190.

At the rear of the hall is a large patio area where there is furniture provided which is suitable for use outside.

There is a wealth of weekly activities such as the hugely popular and well attended Cheerful Cuppa held every Tuesday from 10.00 to 12.00. This gives villager's the chance to meet up and have a hot/cold drink with a slice of cake. The weekly friendly ART group welcomes all of any ability and runs on Tuesday's from 2pm to 4pm.

The first Saturday of each month there is the Pop-Up market from 9.00am to 2pm run by Paula Brown who is contactable at

[paulabrown998@btinternet.com](mailto:paulabrown998@btinternet.com) or 07592991989.

The Friends of Netheravon School PTFA have Prize Bingo on the last Sunday of each month from 1pm to 5pm.

There are also a number of weekly fitness classes for all abilities.

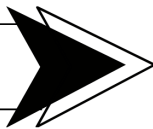
