A word from Phillip Bromiley, Team Rector



How should I vote?

I wonder what you think of politicians? Do you trust them? Are they ideologists who really want to make a difference in the world or are they out for what they can get? It seems to me that more than ever, a key facet of the general election will be trust. Expenses scandals, broken promises, evasive answers to questions, all these things erode the public confidence.

Trust is essentially about truth and the Bible has a lot to say about truth. For Scripture, truth is everything. The most significant truth claim of the Bible is that Jesus rose from the dead. If it is true, then yes, it happened. If it is not true, then no, it didn't happen. What we can't say is, it's nearly true or it's one of many truths. The Bible doesn't let us sit on the fence. We must decide.

If we believe in the resurrection, then we cast our vote for Jesus. In doing so, we make our mark against His name. What mark do we place on our ballot paper? A cross. The Cross is a symbol of truth. If Jesus were running for seat in Parliament (as an Independent?), would you vote for Him? Perhaps He wouldn't be offering sufficient tax incentives or cuts in spending?

How should we vote this year? I'd like us to look beyond Party politics and search the hearts of the candidates themselves. Who has the motivation to stand up for truth and a Society founded upon justice and equality? Who wants to sacrificially serve our communities? Who is the most trustworthy? I think the best advice comes from Paul's letter to the Philippians: He says, Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honourable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. (Ch 4 v 8) Perhaps this might shape our vote on the big day? If this isn't our guiding principle, then we might just get the politicians we deserve.

The Netheravon Top Hat Club

This club, a “Friendly Society”, played an important role in the villages from 1840 onwards. It was a mutual benevolent society into which members paid regularly and received benefits on sickness and death for themselves and their families.

Here are some of the rules and fines :

Failure to wear a top hat to official Top Hat Club meetings - 2s.6d

Cursing, swearing or drunk at an official Top Hat Club meeting – 3s.6d

Giving beer to a non-member on Top Hat Club Day – 2s.6d

Failure to follow the ban on Top Hat Club Day – 2s.6d

Fighting at a Top Hat Club meeting – 5s

Theft or embezzlement of funds – exclusion from membership

Injury to persons or property on way to or from a Top Hat Club meeting - exclusion from membership

Refusal to abide by the rules - exclusion from membership

Fraudulent admission to the Top Hat Club - exclusion from membership

Fair Day

Fundraising events were held, in particular the annual village fair on the 29th May. Schools were closed for the day. The members marched round the village led by a band, stopping at the large houses and farms to collect donations. They stopped at Netheravon church for a special service, followed by a lunch at the Dog and Gun Inn, where there was also maypole dancing. Beer was three halfpence or twopence a pint, locally brewed.

In the afternoon there was a fairground with roundabouts and swings in front of Manor farm, half way up White Sheet Hill. Later there were sports competitions and dancing. A wonderful day of celebration.

There was a revival of the Top Hat fair Day in the early 1990s.

Report from PC Kinge and PCSO Kaur

PC Kinge and PCSO Kaur have been made aware of an increase in anti-social behaviour at the BMX track on Mill Road over the last two weeks, where 10 -12 children have been setting fires, swearing at passers-by and throwing aerosol cans into the fire which is extremely dangerous. I'd like to ask parents 'do you know where your children are?' Many of the young people we have spoken to openly admit that they have lied to their parents saying they are at youth clubs or staying with friends, or other venues. We're concerned that parents are unaware of what they're children are up to and that they are unsupervised and could be placing themselves or others in danger. **It is your parental responsibility to know where your children are and what they are doing.**

Due to this, regular patrols will be conducted in this area and if there are continued reports of anti-social behaviour in this area those involved will be dealt with robustly.

Please speak with your children so they understand how this could not only have consequences for themselves, physically from a fire but also that those around them are being affected by the language they are using. Netheravon is a small village with many families with young children and those of an older generation; open spaces should be available for all to use and enjoy.

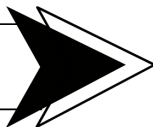
