Netheravon Parish Council Meeting Thursday 11th July 2024

Report by Wilts. Councillor

Cllr Blair-Piling reported that all parking machines in Wiltshire are being replaced, starting with Marlborough, as well as card they should all take cash.

He also reported that he is attending Town Hall meetings with Cllr Wright to assist with the resettlement of the Afghans in the area, reminding people that these people were the people who had helped the British when we were in Afghanistan.

Planning

PL/2024/05482 – 1, Wexland Avenue – building a side extension on the western edge of the house to convert the existing garage in to a store room and have a small utility attached to the house. As there is existing off-street parking loss of a garage is not a big consideration. Recommended to approve.

On 2nd July NPC had confirmation that the Planning Inspectorate has dismissed the appeal lodged concerning planning permission on the land at Pigott Close. Case APP/Y3940/W/23/3324066. The land will not have houses facing A345 built on it. The pair of semi-detached houses already approved fronting Pigott Close remain approved. The land remains up for sale.

It was reported that Gullies in the High St were blocked and causing flooding in the recent heavy rain. Mill Road/Thorne Road is also blocked – Clerk to report to Wilts. County Council.

The Art Group was formed in September 2022 to provide an environment for budding artists and those artists who wish to improve their skills. The Committee Room of Phoenix Hall, Netheravon is hired every Tuesday afternoon from 2-4pm. With its warm, cosy and bright atmosphere plus a new kitchen it is ideal for art & socialising with a FREE cup of tea/coffee. The Group was awarded grants by Netheravon Parish Council, Fittleton cum Haxton Parish Council and Wiltshire Council to pay for insurance, a tutor and hall hire. Our tutor is Franklin Grimes from Figcheldean who is a kindly octogenarian and former art teacher at Stonehenge School (now Avon Valley).

A £2 session fee charged to artists has been used to provide extra art materials for beginners and a small library of books on how to draw and paint landscapes, faces and any other subject. There have been 174 attendees already in 2024, which shows how popular the Art Group has become. Anybody can just turn up and will get a welcome.

Fittleton cum Haxton Parish Council

The recent meeting of Fittleton cum Haxton Parish Council took place at Fittleton All Saints Church on **9 July**. The parish council were pleased to welcome their new parish clerk Laura Turner.

Our Wiltshire councillor, Ian Blair-Pilling, updated the meeting on a number of local issues.

The defibrillators in Fittleton and Haxton will need new batteries at a cost of £400 each. They will be ordered and installed to ensure that we have fully working defibrillators for our parishioners should the need arise.

The speed of vehicles using the Everleigh Road has been a cause of concern for some time. Cllr Georgeson recently addressed Wiltshire's recent LHFIG (Local Highways and Footpaths Improvement Group), to request permission to erect a Speed Indicator Device (SID) and white lines to indicate a pedestrian walkway. The Chief Engineer will arrange a site meeting with the parish council and a monitoring device will be installed to monitor speeds and the need for a SID.

Fittleton cum Haxton Parish Council's next meeting is on **10 September, 7:30pm at Phoenix Hall**. Everyone is welcome to come to the meeting. If you have any questions, please send them, in advance, to **clerkfittletonhaxton@gmail.com**

Report from PC Kinge and PCSO Kaur



Wiltshire is a rural county and agriculture dominates 73% of our landscape. Livestock worrying is when a dog chases and/or attacks livestock in rural or agricultural areas. No matter how well behaved you think your dog is, it's every dog's instinct to chase, even if they are usually obedient and good with other animals.

We want to take the time to pass some important messages regarding livestock worrying and what you can do to stop it from happening:

- Keep dogs on a short lead when around livestock.
- Clear up after your dog as faeces can harm cattle and sheep – and humans too!
- Remember your actions can affect other people's lives and livelihoods.
- Tampering with farm signs and electric fences that are intended to everybody keep safe could have serious consequences.
- Please do not remove signs that are there to keep people safe and always leave gates how you found them - or follow instructions on signs on gates.
- If you see a dog or dogs chasing livestock please call 999 and provide as much information as possible.
- Photo or video evidence of any dogs may help if you can do so safely.

To report wildlife crime you can report incidents online using the Rural Crime Reporting Tool or call 101 after an event or 999 if a crime is in progress.

Livestock worrying has a huge impact on landowners. Please read the above and look at the information poster attached for more information on the matter.

Phoenix Hall AGM

The Phoenix Hall Management Committee held the Annual General Meeting at the hall on Wednesday 3rd July. This event represented the yearly opportunity to summarise how the hall has been used in the year and a review of the financial position. Unfortunately despite notifying in the newsletter and via social media no members of the public from Netheravon, Haxton nor Fittleton attended.

We are pleased to advise the hall is now sporting new blinds in the main hall which together with the pictures donated by Caroline Aubrey-Fletcher make the hall look first class. Many thanks to Caroline for her hard work. The hall has also been repainted and 'touched up' thanks to Steve Perry.

On the financial side we recorded a total of £12,512.45 in rental income, fundraising (through the Race Night organised by Alan Wood) and other sources. From an expenditure perspective we spent £11,840.25 covering, inter alia, wages / utilities / repairs. We also wrote off £1,557.00 in capital expenditure for the new fire doors.

Our trading surplus of £672.20 is a great improvement on 2023/4 thanks to the hard work of the committee.

We look forward to the future knowing we still have challenges, such as the sanding and polishing of the main floor, but with the help of everyone we are confident of a bright year.

Do consider renting the hall for your special occasion or if you have an idea for a club or activity so that we can ensure it's future for the villages.

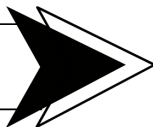
