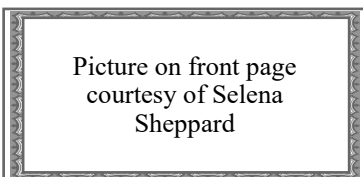

## A word from Phillip Bromiley, our Team Rector:



### All Change

They say change is inevitable, except from a vending machine. October is a month of seasonal change. Naturally, the final throws of summer sunshine begin to give way to the alternate beauty of red, yellow and brown leaves on our trees in their autumnal display. There is change too in our church life at the moment.

Rev Gale Hunt is retiring after having served as Team Vicar in the Avon River Team for 12 years. During this time, Gale has been a dedicated, loyal presence in our churches and greatly valued member of the Staff Team. Gale guided us through a lengthy Interregnum (before I was appointed as Team Rector), the small matter of a Covid pandemic, and the subsequent financial crisis. Gale has served the wider area as Rural Dean, after a stint as Assistant Rural Dean, and made a significant contribution as a school governor for both Netheravon and Bulford.

We are immensely grateful to Gale for giving us these precious years of her ministry. It's often, only when a Vicar leaves, do we see the fruit of their work and the impact they have made on lives round and about. As a fellow priest, I have benefitted hugely from Gale's eye for details and her administrative capabilities, overseeing rotas and website, and keeping us all up to date with the latest Diocesan thinking on a given topic (eg Safeguarding).

As we prepare for the next Chapter, there will be discussions around finding a new Team Vicar and shaping their role for the future of the Avon River Team. In order to justify a new Team Vicar being appointed for our churches, we must be in good heart, have secure finances and growing congregations. So I am appealing to us all throughout the Villages and wider community. Please support the local church in any way you can in the months ahead: come to the odd service (we have a huge variety of them), offer to help out either practically or by regular donation, and pray for your church too as we enter this time of transition.

## **Netheravon Parish Council News from 12th September meeting**

The Chairman, Cllr Ayling thanked everyone that had been involved watering the hanging baskets in the High Street and looking after the tubs around the village. It all looked amazing and down to the hard work of the volunteers, thank you.

### **Village Enhancement/Netheravon in Bloom**

The allotments and tubs have been judged, winners informed and invited to the next Parish council meeting for a small celebration. Please see elsewhere in this newsletter.

Well done to everyone for their amazing efforts this year, and also to all the people involved in the community allotment which has been providing lots of lovely produce for the Community Larder.

### **Planning**

There is a planning application in for Highview Farm Buildings, Enford and Netheravon will hold a joint meeting to take any comments forward.

### **Recreation**

School Close Play Area - The Council are meeting with Wiltshire Council on the 20<sup>th</sup> September to discuss whether the Parish Council take over the maintenance and ownership of this play area going forward.

### **Highways**

The Council are meeting with Wiltshire County Council Highways department soon regarding some of the issues within the village, blocked gullies, broken pavements, flooding etc.

### **Wiltshire Bobby Van Trust**

The council agreed to give a donation of £50 to the Bobby Trust who for over 26 years have been supporting the most vulnerable people in our community. The charity secures the homes of older people (over 60) and those registered disabled (over 18) who have become or are at risk of becoming victims of crime. Importantly they help rebuild confidence enabling them to stay at home, their one safe place. All the work undertaken and the devices they use are free of charge to the recipient.

**PHOENIX HALL NETHERAVON** Managed by volunteers.

The Phoenix Hall is a large open venue that provides an excellent facility for many activities/meetings and is used by many to celebrate special occasions. The hall looks very smart when dressed and a sound system is available. The front door and ramps give full disable access.

The main hall and smaller room both have kitchens. There is also a fully equipped commercial large catering kitchen located at the back of the main hall where all table/glass ware/fridges and cooking equipment are available and included in the hire charge.

In the main hall and again included in the hire charge are chairs and a choice of rectangle or large round tables with seating for up to 120 people. Linen tablecloths in a neutral colour are available. The mixed capacity is 190.

At the rear of the hall is a large patio area where furniture provided which is suitable for use outside.

There is a wealth of weekly activities such as the hugely popular and well attended Cheerful Cuppa held every Tuesday from 10.00 to 12.00. This gives villager's the chance to meet up and have a hot/cold drink with a slice of home-made cake.

The weekly friendly ART group welcomes all of any ability and runs on Tuesday's from 2pm to 4pm. The contact person is Alan Wood who would be very happy to hear from you just email him [wood94@btinternet.com](mailto:wood94@btinternet.com)

The first Saturday of each month there is the Pop-Up market from 9.00am to 2pm run by Paula Brown who is contactable at [paulabrown998@btinternet.com](mailto:paulabrown998@btinternet.com) or 07592991989.

The Friends of Netheravon School PTFAs have Prize Bingo on the last Sunday of each month from 1pm to 5pm.

There are a variety of different successful exercise classes held at the hall. Are you a fitness instructor looking for a new venue then please do contact Pam Perry the booking clerk who would be very happy to show you around.

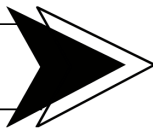

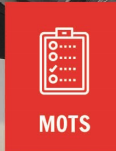
