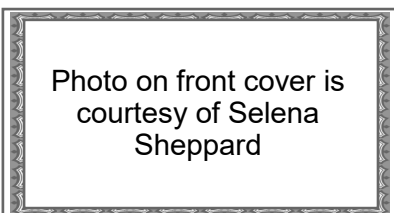

May Day, May Day

The month of May always brings memories of Oxford days. May at Magdalen bridge, amidst choirs and all-night revelers. In all honesty, I only ever did it once, out of sheer curiosity, it was fun, but I couldn't really justify the sacrifice of sleep deprivation. Back in the day, it was common to see brave souls (often assisted by Dutch courage) leap off the bridge into the Cherwell river below. Injuries often followed and the leap was later banned in 2005. Sadly, the water is simply too shallow. What does the choir sing from the top of the bell tower? A hymn entitled Hymnus Eucharisticus... this is the translation:

We worship you, O God the Father,
we offer you our praise,
for you nourish our bodies,
and minds with heavenly grace.

We adore you, O Jesus,
you, the only begotten Son,
you, who did not disdain
to submit to birth in the Virgin's womb.

Driven onto the cross, you were made
the victim of God's wrath.
Through you, our only Saviour,
hope of life returned to us.

To you, Eternal Spirit
by whose breath was born
by Mary the Infant God,
be our eternal blessings.

Triune God, of all humanity
the great author of salvation,
this immense mystery
our tongues all cheer and sing.

What an amazing hymn! It proclaims the wonder of Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The philosopher, Søren Kierkegaard coined the term, "leap of faith". He didn't say we have to blindly jump off a bridge, but rather, when we jump off, we do so trusting that God, in His goodness, will be there. Jesus is far enough away for us to freely choose to jump. He is also near enough though to catch us when we fall.

Netheravon Parish Council News from April's meeting

Cllr Burke welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Police Report- Report sent and read out at the Annual Parish Meeting before the council meeting. Netheravon has low crime incidents, police continue to do rounds, attend coffee mornings when able and also bring the mobile police office to the village.

FINANCE

- a. **Bank Reconciliation** -The bank reconciliation was passed out to councillors before the meeting, all agreed
- a. **The end of year accounts** were sent out before the meeting and agreed
- b. **The Budget for 2026-2027** was discussed and agreed to separate the money received from Wiltshire Council so as not to skew the figures, as this money is to be used for the ongoing maintenance and refurb of Old School Close Park.
- c. Clerk raised the fact that the **Minimum wage** went up on the 1st April, Council all agreed it needed to be paid.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

1. **Highways plus Parish Steward**– potholes at Kings Hill have been repaired, at the APM a member of the public reported Mill Road, where MOD had removed trees some time ago and left temporary fencing and cones in the gap. Clerk has reported to Landmarc and MOD.
2. **Cemetery /Enhancement /Netheravon in bloom** – Clerk still needs to speak to Resident about doing tub and raised the fact that the Cemetery notice board is wobbly and all green. Will speak to the Handyman to see about a repair and clean.
2. **Recreation-** Waiting for a confirmed date for the Nest swing instalment. (post meeting note 24th April) **Old School Close Park** – clerk read out all 3 quotes and council agreed on Love Landscaping to do the work but asked the Clerk to get some previous examples of their work before the go ahead. Handyman has been asked to oversee the landscaping work when it begins.
2. **Allotments** - Just waiting for the last payments for the year. (post meeting note – all received)
3. **Community Allotment and Community Larder.** Clerk to ask the volunteers to let her know when the fruit trees need strimming etc. then ask the Handyman to do it.

6. Phoenix Hall Chairperson report Mar 26

We are hoping to break even as the cost of electric seems to have taken away any profit which would have been used for further maintenance and upgrades to the hall.

Maintenance and Improvements

We are currently looking into have a new heating system costed and looking into any grants available.

Looking ahead

The hall now has bookings for most days and as always' we are grateful for the support of our regular hirers.

7. **Jubilee Committee** – Meeting planned to discuss the village fete within the next few weeks,
8. **Stonehenge Area Board** – not confirmed when the next meeting will be yet.
9. **All Saints school liaison** – successful morning of the choir singing at Cheerful cuppa and £300 raised for the school PTA. Cllr Bridewell reported that the school are keen to have close connections with the community, the choir hopes to return at Christmas.
10. **Netheravon Speed watch Group** – All going well, the lead of the speed watch reported at the Annual Parish Meeting that they have a couple of new volunteers which all helps.
11. **Newsletters** –concern voiced about finances, it is hoped that when the advertising is in, plus donations from other sources it will be fine. Treasurer to write to Fittleton & Haxton regarding a donation. The old newsletters are still in RGV office and waiting to be scanned and digitised. If anyone knows of anyone that has some spare time, please contact the Chairman at RGV.

REPORT BY THE CLERK

Busy time with end of year reports, plus getting quotes for refurbishment of Old School Close Park and sorting out Millenium Park play equipment. It is hoped by the next meeting that the nest swing will be in place.

DATE OF NEXT COUNCIL MEETING

The next meeting of the Netheravon Parish Council will be the AGM on the 14th May 2026 at 7pm in the Phoenix Hall.

Sponsors of the 1920's Sports Day programme we brought you in the March edition of this newsletter

We had an interesting response from a reader to our challenge about the possible year of the 1920s Sports Day programme: Leonard Denman ladies' and gent's hairdresser: "Shingling for women's hair really only hit the headlines in 1924. It was quite complicated to do and the fact that L. Denman was offering it in a very rural area suggests that it might have been later than 1924". Thanks for that Nancy!

It's surprising that five of the businesses mentioned cluster round Old Post Office Lane, the old post office being 116 High St, the house with the Victoria Diamond Jubilee village clock on it. Surviving until the 1960s on the north side of the lane there were temporary looking corrugated iron sheds which must have been the hairdresser's and Mrs White's "Up to date drapery and millinery establishment". At the top of the lane was J. Whitmarsh's Avon Garage, the only one with a telephone, Netheravon 32, and with petrol pumps.

Half way up the lane was the entrance to Herbert Sheppard's Mill Farm "Milk fresh from the cow in sealed bottles delivered daily". Delivery must have been by bicycle or horse and cart and sealed bottles would have been a novelty. The Clock House (Old Post office) was the farmhouse for Mill Farm from 1920 to 1974. It retains its 1897 Victoria Jubilee clock, now owned by the parish and inside, the former postbox. Here also was a room which had been used by the doctor. There was no mains water until the 1950s.

Diagonally opposite to the Clock was the Fox & Hounds which had been located next to Husseys' brewery which closed in 1913. Photographs on postcards of the era show the cob wall which surrounded the field opposite the pub.

Other sponsors of the Sports Day were John Victor Bennett the chemist, well known for his red cough mixture and Parrish's Food, a red iron tonic which turned your teeth black so we drank it through a straw.

Then there was Tom Carter bootmaker whose workshop in the High St had a wonderful pungent smell of leather. Lastly Smith & Kite's garage, petrol etc - but where was this?

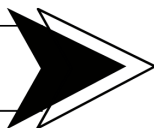
