**The deadline for the next issue will be Friday 19th June.**

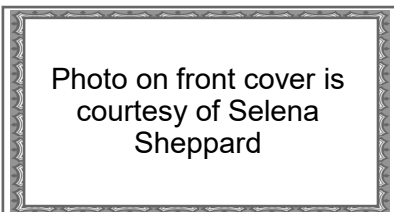

## A word from Rev Joe Stone, Team Vicar.



### The Art of Being Still: Lessons from a June Garden

*"Some flowers are withered and some joys have died; The garden reeks with an East Indian scent From beds where gillyflowers stand weak and spent; The white heat pales the skies from side to side; But in still lakes and rivers, cool, content, Like starry blooms on a new firmament, White lilies float and regally abide."*

So wrote Helen Hunt Jackson in her poem *July*.

June and July are magnificent months, aren't they? This season is a gift, offering us the perfect backdrop to relax and reconnect with friends and family, whether on the beach, in the woods, or simply over a cool drink in the garden. Yet, as the gillyflowers begin to stand "weak and spent," we are reminded that even in the height of summer, there is a pull toward busyness.

### A Lesson in Sitting Still

The story of Mary and Martha in Luke's Gospel perfectly captures this tension between "doing" and "being." When Jesus drops in to visit the two sisters, we see two very different responses to his presence.

Martha immediately goes into "hosting mode," getting busy in the kitchen, likely worrying about the menu and the service. Mary, however, simply sits at Jesus' feet, learning from him and enjoying his company. Eventually, the pressure gets to Martha. She bursts into the room, frustrated: *"Jesus, please tell my lazy sister to get out into the kitchen, do her duty and HELP!"*

Jesus' response is gentle but profound:

*"Martha, Martha, you are worried and upset about many things, but few things are needed—or indeed only one. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her."*

As we move further into July, let's take a leaf out of Mary's book (and the lilies in the pond). Let's find moments to be "cool and content," choosing to sit still and appreciate the gift of the present moment.

## **Netheravon Parish Council News from AGM 14<sup>th</sup> May 2026**

Cllr Burke welcomed everyone to the meeting

### **PUBLIC QUESTION TIME**

A member of the public asked the Council for their view on the MOD's plan on putting Orchard Farm with the old coal yard up for auction by the MOD. We do not currently have a development plan and whilst the area is currently within the permitted area, the field behind it is outside of the development area.

There were various discussions around land being a Site of Scientific Interest, Tree preservation orders and Assets of community value. The Auction will be held at the beginning of June. It was agreed that a working party come together soon and decide the best way forward.

### **REPORT BY WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR**

There will be a full Wiltshire Council meeting Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> May.

Ian is putting forward 3 motions

A303 to Highways, what is being done about the problems caused when the A303 is busy and traffic is diverted through our small villages now that the Tunnel has been scrapped.

Local Highways Footpaths Investment Group (LHFIG) – The funding has been cut by 50%, motion to bring it back.

Information Sharing – Information from the Council is not coming through the Area boards, which means that Parish Councils are not being kept up to date on changes. From June it is likely that Ian Blair-Pilling will not be standing as Chair on the LHFIG or the Stonehenge Area Board.

### **POLICE REPORT**

Received after the meeting – Reports of items taken from garage at Harefield Crescent, fishing items from Lower Road and Anti-Social behavior at the Church and Corfe Jump Park. Hopefully the last two are dealt with now.

### **ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN**

Cllr Burke was nominated for Chairman by Cllr Coslett, proposed by Cllr Coslett and Seconded by Cllr Perry, unanimously voted in.

### **TO RECEIVE CHAIRMAN'S DECLARATION OF ACCEPTANCE OF OFFICE**

Cllr Burke signed the declaration of office.

### **ELECTION OF VICE CHAIRMAN**

Cllr P Perry was nominated by Cllr S Perry proposed by Cllr Coslett and seconded by Cllr Brown, unanimously voted in.

### **DECLARATION OF ACCEPTANCE OF OFFICE – Cllr P Perry and Cllr Burke both**

signed the declaration of acceptance into office.

### **FINANCE**

- a. Bank Reconciliation -The bank reconciliation was passed out to councillors before the meeting. All at zero.
- b. Approval of Annual Governance Statement- chair read out the report from the Internal Auditor and read out the statements of the Annual Governance statement.
- c. Approval of Accounts 25-26- As per the internal audit, all fine. Proposed by Cllr Coslett and seconded by Cllr S Perry.
- d. Approve expenditure for insurance quote – All agreed, as cost hadn't gone up very much.
- e. Approval of payment for Booking Clerk Phoenix Hall – All agreed
- f. Newsletter Donation – It was agreed to give a £500 donation to the Newsletter.

Finances show a current bank balance of £1749.76

We are up on last year by £519.00.

#### **Looking ahead**

The hall now has bookings for most days and as always' we are grateful for the support of our regular hirers.

We continue to advertise in our village's local newsletter.

### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

1. **Planning** – three planning requests in the last week, Cllr Coslett read them out and all agreed to support. Responses sent to the council.
2. **Highways** - The High Street will be closed for 2 days, 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> May. Residents should be able to get access to their properties. The bent Lamppost at the school has been taken down. Highways are going to chase the MOD again regarding making the bus stop bigger and more set back at Harefield Crescent.
3. **Cemetery /enhancement /Netheravon in bloom** – Clerk to reiterate a request for volunteers to plant the tubs again especially the one in Hales Road (post meeting note, someone volunteered) and also to water the hanging baskets in the High St. volunteers can contact the Clerk to the Parish Council on [Clerk@Netheravonparishcouncil.co.uk](mailto:Clerk@Netheravonparishcouncil.co.uk) or 07519 503377. Clerk to purchase hanging baskets for the High Street.
4. **Recreation** – Old School Close – Landscape and fence work will begin on the 4<sup>th</sup> June, the benches are currently being sanded and varnished, ready to hopefully ready for the same time. The rocker springs have been purchased and will be next to be refurbished. The trim trail has finally been repaired in Millenium Park and the nest swing has been a great success. The slide would cost £2400 to replace, the Handyman is going to have a go at repairing it to see if that will work at a fraction of the price.
5. **Allotments**- water issue at the Dog and Gun sorted by RGV, new combination padlock put in at the Pigot Road site to make it easier going forward.
6. **Community Allotment and Community Larder** All ok Handyman has strimmed around the fruit trees, it has been reported back that we only lost one of the 25 fruit trees that were planted last year.

7. Budget 26-27 updated, thanks to Cllrs Brown and O Grady for their support.
8. Asset List has been updated to include Old School Close Park
9. Concrete Gravel board broken in village Hall, someone has put the broken one back, it was agreed to leave it for now.

### A double wedding

There was a double wedding at Netheravon church on 28th November 1867. The brides were sisters and lived at the Fox & Hounds pub. Their father, William Selwood, the innkeeper there, had died the previous June and Ann (called Annie) had taken over as innkeeper.

Ann Selwood (24) married Emmanuel Plank (26), a groom at Netheravon House, who was the son of Thomas Plank, a labourer.

Ellen Selwood (19) married Jacob Sheppard (21), a blacksmith. His father also called Jacob, was a blacksmith too. All four were literate with good handwriting: it is surprising to see how many young people could not sign their names in the church registers at this time, and put a cross.

On the 26 July 1874 both couples emigrated to New Zealand from London on the ship "Bebington" (924 tons) landing at Hawkes Bay (Napier) on the 20th November. Their passage was assisted by the government alongside about 40,000 others in that year. By this time Ellen Sheppard had given birth to Elizabeth, Emma and Ellen. Annie had five children, George, Allan, Angelina, James and Elizabeth.

It was a rough voyage. The *Bebington* was known as "an old tub", being slow and prone to disease and collisions with other ships. It put into Dartmouth a week after setting off to repair a condenser and suffered later damage from rough seas. Its route was via the Cape of Good Hope. On board were 317 immigrants, divided into 3 groups; families, single men (from age 12) and single women. George, born in 1861 before the marriage, was separated from his family. There were 4 births and 4 deaths during the voyage. One woman was kept in irons in a tiny cabin for 2 weeks for keeping a diary of the journey.

A descendent of Ellen's family is buried in Netheravon churchyard having died from disease while serving in the First World War. Much later, in the 1960s, another relative collected a dinner service from the cottage of Ivy Sheppard / Punter at Lower End Netheravon, near the site of the blacksmith's, which had been a wedding present Jacob and Ellen were unable to take with them in 1867.

**FITTLETON CUM HAXTON**  
**ANNUAL PARISH REPORT May 2025 to May 2026**

2025/26 has taken the form of years past but there is always something going on within the parish.

I will start on a some what down side, vandalism. Haxton has been hit three times over the past 3 months, graffiti on a cob wall and a dwellings garden wall, spray paint on the Haxton PC Notice Board and finally our new Finger Post on the X Roads has 'lost' 2 of its fingers. Wiltshire Police have been involved and crime numbers issued.

On a lighter vein.

The 6 councillors continue to work at their various roles within the Parish and this year a welcome addition to the fold is Cllr Julian Lamont. Laura Turner remains as Parish Clerk and Finance Officer. Cllr Symes is our representative (rep) on the Phoenix Hall Committee and the allotments rep. Cllr Gowman looks after planning applications and the Jubilee Committee. Cllr Jago is our second rep on planning and also looks after the flower tubs in the parish. Cllr Friery deals with the Parish Steward and Highways. Cllr Lamont is our 'fix it' man which has yet to have a designated title! For the keen eyed of you who read this you will note that we have a vacancy on the council as we are scheduled for 7 councillors.....

A number of 'events' have taken place in the past 12 months and in no particular order they are listed here... the sycamore tree near the Church Path was deemed unsafe by Wiltshire Council who own and maintain that piece of ground. After some 6 months the tree was taken down and replaced like for like. A great shame to see the old tree gone especially as it looked so well in full leaf. We hope the new tree will be a worthy replacement and in years to come will look equally good.

Christmas drinks took place in Fittleton Manor's barn with kind permission from Mr & Mrs Philipps, a great success and enjoyed by all those that attended.

Christmas lights were not erected in 2025 due to the previously mentioned tree being unsafe, an alternative route for them will be hopefully sought for 2026.

New 30mph road signs were erected in Haxton in the summer along with new 'gates' which enhance the 30 signs. The cost to the parish was £1375, the balance paid by Wiltshire Council.

Downs View Close had a new street sign erected in early summer after a vehicle reversed into the existing one. We intend to upgrade further signs during this year as finances permit.

The allotments continue to be popular and have all been taken up. A vote of thanks must go to Sheila & Martin Symes for maintaining the site and shed.

2026 has seen a rise in our running costs hence the increase in our precept for this financial year. The list is quite long for such a small parish but it includes liability insurance, audit costs, clerks wages, website costs, defibrillator maintenance to name but a few.

Planning applications filter through to us on a fairly regular basis and that includes those that wish to carry out works on trees within the Conservation Area of the villages.

We continue to have new residents move into the parish, a welcome addition to our relatively small community.

Finally your Parish Council meets every other month where all are welcome, details on our website, Parish Magazine and Notice Boards.

That concludes the Parish report.

Our next meeting is Tuesday 14th July 7pm at All Saints Church Fittleton, all are welcome.

Analysis shows people aged 55 to 74 experienced the greatest financial losses, accounting for almost half of the total amount stolen. Although men submitted a higher number of reports overall, women experienced higher individual losses, making up just over 40 per cent of the total value reported.

Romance fraud remains closely linked to online platforms, particularly social media and dating sites, where offenders can create convincing false identities. Investigators are also seeing increased use of AI-generated images and messages to support these profiles. In many cases, it is also linked to fake investment opportunities, including cryptocurrency, increasing the financial risk to victims.

As part of this campaign, we are urging the public to stay cautious when forming relationships online and to recognise the warning signs:

- Be cautious of individuals who develop relationships very quickly or express strong feelings early on
- Be wary of excuses not to meet in person or to avoid live video calls
- Never send money, cryptocurrency or gift cards to someone you have not met face to face
- Be alert to requests linked to investments, medical emergencies, or travel costs
- Speak to a trusted friend or family member if something feels unusual or pressured

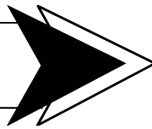

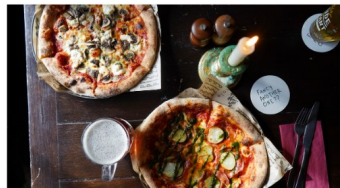
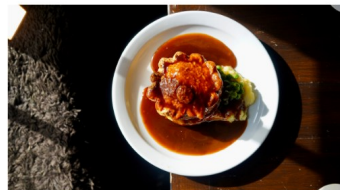
